Filippo Silvestri Square Bevagna, Italy

The heart of the city and the fulcrum of its development in the Middle Ages, the square, whose layout dates back to the 12th-13th centuries, constitutes one of the most evocative and illustrious architectural bodies among Umbrian cities, concentrating valuable religious and civil monuments.





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La Rocca Sonora Gualdo Cattaneo, Italy

The Rocca Sonora is the true protagonist of the village, its elegant austerity, and its mighty walls, capturing the gaze of those who come up here. Once a privileged place of the sighting, today it is a splendid panoramic terrace.





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Museum San Francesco Montefalco, Italy

The San Francesco Museum Complex is a prestigious museum in Umbria, thanks to the quality of the materials that make up the collection and the monumental appearance of the complex. An essential testimony to Renaissance painting from the 15th-16th centuries, it consists of the Church of St. Francis, Civic Art Gallery, Archaeological section, friars' cellars and exhibition spaces for temporary exhibitions.





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Olive Tree of Marciano Giano dell'Umbria, Italy

The centuries-old olive tree of Macciano is venerated by the locals because it is said that St Francis of Assisi leaned on its trunk. For this reason, the oil obtained was used for votive lamps and as medicine.





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Roman Baths Bevagna, Italy

Date back to the 2nd century A.D. Among the remains, one can admire the magnificent 81-square-metre floor of the frigidarium hall, entirely preserved. Made with a sophisticated technique by almost certainly non-local mosaicists, it depicts both real animals - such as octopuses, lobsters, and dolphins - and fantastic animals at the bottom of the pool, such as tritons, horses and sea bulls.





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The Abbey of San Felice Giano dell'Umbria, Italy

The splendid and imposing San Felice Abbey stands at the foot of the Martani Mountains, surrounded by centuries-old olive trees and holm oaks.

It is situated in an isolated and dominant position, not far from the village of Giano dell'Umbria.





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The Balcony of Umbria Montefalco, Italy

The enchanting Umbrian village is located in a very privileged geographical position that earned it the nickname 'Umbria's railing' in 1568. The reason is easily said: Montefalco's Belvedere offers a 360-degree view of the valley below. Indeed, it is possible to admire breathtaking views of the valleys of the Clitunno, Topino, and Tiber, as well as of neighboring towns such as Spello, Foligno, Perugia, or Assisi.





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The Castel of Morcicchia Giano dell'Umbria, Italy

Compared to the other villages and reached by a somewhat impervious dirt road, it is enveloped in silence and an atmosphere of bygone days and offers a panorama that will leave you speechless, due to its great environmental value.





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Torti Theatre Bevagna, Italy

The Torti Theatre is located in Bevagna's main square, Piazza Silvestri, inside the ancient and mighty Palazzo dei Consoli, an emblematic symbol of the village's medieval past, a legacy still alive thanks to the famous and characteristic historical re-enactment of 'Il Mercato delle Gaitè'.





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Trinci Palace Foligno, Italy

Trinci Palace is the most famous of the palaces in the historic center of Foligno, as well as one of the most interesting late Gothic residences in central Italy. It was the home of the important Trinci family, who ruled the city between 1305 and 1439. It is rightly said to house a 'figurative encyclopedia of the humanistic culture of the time'.
